

Dear Prime Minister,

I am writing to you in your role as Prime Minister to express my opposition to the proposed ALTO High Speed Rail project and its impacts on rural communities throughout Eastern Ontario.

The project would divide farms, homes, and communities with a fenced rail corridor and limited crossings, disrupting daily life and reducing property values. Road closures and rerouting would increase emergency response times, strain rural infrastructure, and impact access to work, schools, and services. Local businesses and agriculture would also be negatively affected.

There are serious environmental concerns, including risks to wetlands, endangered species, the Frontenac Arch Biosphere and the Napanee Limestone Plain, as well as potential impacts on watersheds, drainage, and groundwater.

With estimated costs of \$60–\$120 billion and little benefit to rural communities, this project raises significant concerns about value and fairness. In addition, the consultation process has been inadequate and lacks transparency.

I respectfully ask that you oppose this project in its current form and advocate for a more thorough and transparent review process that protects rural communities and the environment.
